

Alexander Paterson

Member for Capricornia (Queensland) 1901-1903

Ascotland. On the completion of his education, Paterson joined a shipping firm and became a branch manager. He spent time in Spain and London before ill health forced his migration to Victoria in 1875. Between 1877 and 1889 Paterson worked at and established a number of stores in Queensland and Victoria, and as an accountant settled in Rockhampton, Queensland. He was manager of the Central Meat Export Company for ten years.

In 1901 Paterson was elected to represent the federal seat of Capricornia in the House of Representatives at the first federal election. A supporter of free trade, Paterson was the only member of the first Parliament elected as an Independent. He was a member of the Select Committee on Decimal Coinage in 1901 and did not stand for re-election in 1903.

The electorate of Capricornia was named after its locality. The district name apparently originated from the fact that the Tropic of Capricorn passes through it.
